Orville Todd Grigor, affectionately known as Todd, beloved brother, father, grandfather, great grandfather, uncle, cousin and friend, passed away in Greensboro, Georgia on Tuesday, November 18, 2025 at the age of 63 years.

He attended Harry Ainlay High School in Edmonton, where he was a gifted and enthusiastic athlete. During these years, he forged friendships and created memories that endured throughout his life. He purchased his first motorcycle in high school and achieved a Grade seven level in guitar—early signs of his lifelong passions for sport, music, and speed. As a Queen's Venturer, Todd used these skills to mold his life filled with determination, resourcefulness, and

independence.

As a young adult, Todd served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Bristol, England, where he developed a deep and abiding love for Jesus Christ. His devotion to the Savior and his desire to emulate His example were evident in all aspects of his life.
